
Complete this application to apply for a CAL FIRE Burn Permit. CAL FIRE Burn Permits are only valid within the State Responsibility Area (SRA), or where CAL FIRE has jurisdictional authority. This site will verify if the burn location falls within <u>designated areas</u> & where burning is allowed.

Burn Permit Application*

Broadcast Burn Permit (LE-7/8) allows a Controlled Application of Fire to the land for fuels reduction purposes (e.g., grasslands, shrublands, and oak woodlands). **No Pile Burning!**







The permit does not relieve you of any legal responsibility for the safe use of fire or allow burning in violation of any State law, county ordinance, local regulations restricting, or regulating the use of fire.

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE to obtain all permits. A CAL FIRE Burn Permit does not replace permits required by other Agencies. Permits are only valid on "Permissive Burn Days" as determined by the California Air Resources Board, local CAL FIRE Unit or the local air district.

Broadcast Burning is the controlled application of fire to the land to reduce wildfire hazards, clear downed trees, control plant diseases, improve rangeland and wildlife habitats, and restore natural ecosystems as outlined in <u>Public Resources Code 4491-4494</u>. A This type of burning is sometimes called a controlled burn, prescribed fire, or prescribed burning and is one of the most important tools used to manage fire today. As catastrophic wildfires continue to be a growing concern in California, the use of prescribed burning to reduce hazardous fuels is projected to increase. Daily burn decisions are issued based on the forecast of air quality and meteorological conditions that can affect smoke dispersion. Certain types of projects may require CEQA approval. To obtain information about Agrcultural and Prescribed Burn Notices visit the <u>Prescribed Fire Information Reporting System (PFIRS)</u> website.

A site visit is required before a permit is issued. Processing of the application can take up to 10 days. Be sure to provide adequate time for this review when scheduling your project. During the site visit, you may be asked for a burn plan or a contingency plan prior to burning. Here is NWCG Prescribed Fire Plan Template ### you can reference.

What can be burned?

Brush, Grass, Timber or Timber Slash. Broadcast Burn Permit may be issued to Land owners who burn larger than 4ft x 4ft burn piles or burn on vacant land.

Instructions

Step 1: Complete the online application form. You will need to enter the following information:

- Burn location address or APN, county, mailing address
- Project start and end date
- Burn plan documents PDF only (optional)
 - If providing a Burn Plan, you will need to know max wind speed, max temperature, min humidity, and acceptable wind direction.
- · Material to be burned
 - o Grass
 - o Brush
 - o Timber
 - o Timber slash
- Estimated acres to be burned

Step 2: Click submit on the last page and you will receive a Pending or Denied email within a few minutes. If you do not receive the email, please check your spam or junk folder. A CAL FIRE Representative will contact you to schedule a site visit.

Choose Address if your burn location has an address; otherwise, select Assessor Parcel Number (APN).*





Map*

View the map diagram for an overview of the map.

On a device with location services enabled: The map will zoom to your current location or click the Find My Location icon (no need to enter your address in the search box). If the burn permit is for a different location, tap on the map and enter correct address into the search box or move around in the map then tap on the correct location. Tap OK when complete.

On a device without location services enabled: Start typing the burn location address in the map search box ("Find address or place") and click on the correct address in the list that appears below the search box. If the address does not appear or you want to change the location of the blue pin in the map, you can click/tap in the map on the correct location. TIP: The map will try to use your location services. If your browser does not have location services. turned on, this is not needed. Click the X to ignore the message.



Please read the following rules, watch the video and sign below.

The Broadcast Burn Permit (LE-7/8) is subject to the following terms and conditions:

- The permittee shall comply with all fire laws, ordinances, and regulations.
- 2. The permittee shall notify the adjoining property owners and occupants of his/her intentions to burn and the date such burning will take place. This notice must be given not less than 2 days prior to the start of such burning, except that co-tenants having rights or facilities on or adjoining the permittee's property shall be notified not less than 15 days prior to the start of burning.
- 3. This permit is valid only on those days which are not prohibited by the State Air Resources Board pursuant to Section 41855 of the Health and Safety Code of by the Local Air Pollution Control District. Prior to burning permittee will contact Local Air Pollution Control District.
- 4. This permit does not relieve the permittee from using reasonable and prudent care to prevent damage to the property of others or injury to person as prescribed by law. In the event of an escape of the fire that requires suppression costs, depending on the specific factors of the project and burn, the permit holder may be held liable for those suppression costs.
- 5. Before burning, permittee shall contact the Fire Station.
- Upon completion of the burning, the permittee shall notify the issuing agency headquarters immediately after the fire is extinguished and the last watch person has been removed.
